

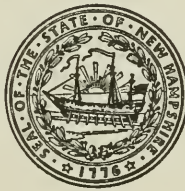

TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookfield, N. H. in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March, next, at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay Town charges in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid on class V highways and appropriate the sum of \$318.67 as the Town share.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Sanbornville Fire Precinct.
6. To see if the Town will vote to use \$500.00 of anticipated surplus money toward the purchase of a tank truck for the Sanbornville Fire Precinct.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$600.00 for the use of the Sanbornville dump.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Gafney Library.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for Huggins Hospital.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for partial participation in Lakes Region Association.

12. To see if the Town will vote to contract the summer and winter maintenance of Town Roads.

13. If Article 12 is not accepted, to see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to appoint the Road Agent.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of oiling Town Roads.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 to move the Churchill School to the Town Hall and construct foundation for same.

16. To see if the Town will vote to have the Police Officer appointed rather than elected.

Analysis of Present Conditions

Clearly one of the original reasons for the supervisory union persists: many towns are too small to justify the hiring of a superintendent of schools. Nevertheless, the automobile and the bus

have become highly acceptable and rapid means of transportation since 1919. The road network in New Hampshire in 1966 is quite superb which means that communities once an hour away from each other are now only ten or twenty minutes apart. The New Hampshire legislature in recognizing the urgency of the need for improved educational opportunities passed legislation encouraging towns to form cooperative districts of five or more communities. These developments (better roads, the bus, cooperative districts) make it possible to consider changing the concept of a supervisory union.

Another force for change rises from various developments of a national nature requiring more and different kinds of education. The country is more oriented to science and technology and to advanced study in other fields than it was in 1919. Education through the high school with access to two or more years of higher education, either in colleges or in advanced technical or vocational training, is expected by employers and encouraged by many more parents. Americans move about more, or at least want to exercise that choice on their own terms rather than be forced from an industry or farm or service agency because of a lack of an adequate education.

These are changing times in educational circles, and signs point to growth and innovation in the immediate future. The AREA concept and Co-operative School Districts will receive much attention in the wake of recent State Board of Education pronouncements concerning secondary school enrollments. There will be a continuance of Federal programs which will effect education in one form or another. We should be watchful and informed so that our decisions, concerning the education of boys and girls, will be based on facts rather than emotions and hearsay.

Throughout these days ahead we will appreciate, as in the past, your continued cooperation in the best interests of boys and girls.
