STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookline, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town and State Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Daniels Academy Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to to raise to defray all Town charges for the year ensuing.
- Article 3. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees, and all other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 4. To see what amount of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges.

- Article 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise andappropriate for Memorial Day.
- Article 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Brookline Public Library.
- Article 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of the State Highway or take any action relating to the same.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an amount of money necessary to secure State aid for the permanent improvement of the highways, under the law passed at the January session of 1905, and to say where same shall be laid out, or take any vote relating to same.
- Article 9. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate money for cutting brush and destroying same along the highways.
- Article 10. To see what action the Town will take in regard to making any discounts on taxes paid on or before December 1st, 1924.
- Article 11. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the repairs of sidewalks and take any action relating to the same.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for celebration of July 4th, 1924.

- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and approwww.libtool.com.cn priate \$300 for new fire hose, or take any action relating thereto.
- Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust or take any action relating thereto.
- Article 15. To see what action the Town will take in regard to a Soldiers' Monument, take any vote thereon, raise any money therefor, or act on anything in relation thereto.
- Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money sufficient to build a dam near the residence of Frank Austin.
