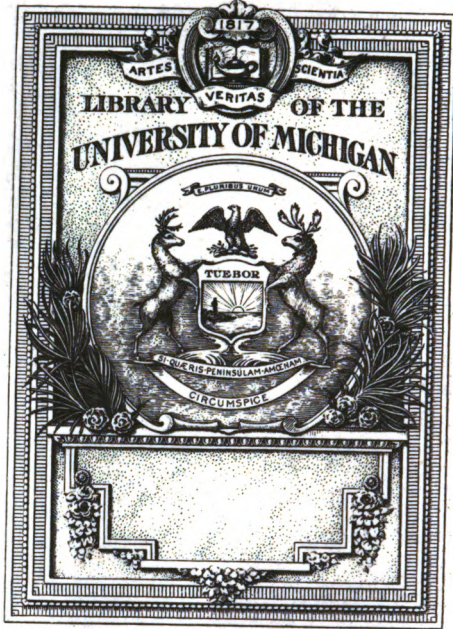

SESSION OF 1913

SPRINGFIELD, ILL., August 12, 1913

In pursuance of the provisions of "An Act for the assessment of property and providing the means therefor, and to repeal a certain Act therein named," approved February 25, 1898, the members-elect of the State Board of Equalization met in the Senate Chamber in the city of Springfield, at 10:00 A.M. on the first Tuesday after the 10th day of August (the same being the 12th day of the month), the following persons being present:

All the members were present with proper credentials, and the oath of office prescribed by the Constitution was duly executed by each member and filed with the Auditor of Public Accounts.

On motion of Mr. Hirsheimer,

Mr. Brady was selected as temporary chairman, and Mr. John J. Coffey as temporary secretary.

Mr. Malone moved that the chairman appoint a committee of five on permanent organization and on formation of the standing committees. The motion prevailed, and

The chairman appointed Messrs. Malone, Sullivan, Martin, Baker, and Hirsheimer.

Mr. Crawford moved that the chairman appoint a committee of five to prepare rules for the use of the board.

The motion prevailed, and

The chairman appointed Messrs. Crawford, Evans, Becker, Murphy, and Watson.

On motion of Mr. Hirsheimer,

The board took a recess of one hour.

The board was called to order by the temporary chairman at the close of the recess.

The Committee on Rules reported through its chairman, Mr. Crawford, as follows:

SPRINGFIELD, ILL., August 12, 1913

To the Honorable State Board of Equalization.

GENTLEMEN: The committee appointed by you to draft and report rules for the State Board of Equalization, respectfully reports that they met and elected A. W. Crawford, Chairman, and Charles J. Murphy, Secretary, and that they unanimously recommend the adoption by the State Board of Equalization of the following rules of order:

RULES OF ORDER

RULE 1.—The chairman shall take the chair at the hour to which the board may have adjourned. *Provided*, that in the absence of the chairman, the board may elect one of its members temporary chairman, who shall preside, have the same powers, and perform the same duties as the chairman; shall immediately call the board to order, and on the appearance of a quorum shall cause the minutes of the preceding meeting to be read, and the following order of business to be observed:

First—Petitions and communications.

Second—Reports of committees.

Third—Resolutions.

RULE 2.—The chairman shall decide all questions of order, subject to an appeal to the board at the request of any two members. When an appeal is taken the chairman may address the board upon the point of order in dispute and the question shall be put, "Shall the decision of the chair stand?"

RULE 3.—When a motion is made and seconded, it shall be stated by the chairman or secretary before being debated.

RULE 4.—Every motion shall be reduced to writing, if the chairman or any member requires it, and any member may call for a statement of the question, which the chairman may give sitting.

RULE 5.—After a motion is stated by the chairman or read by the secretary, it shall be considered as in the possession of the board, but may be withdrawn by the member making the motion, by leave of the board, before decision.

RULE 6.—While the chairman is putting the question, no member shall walk across the room, and while a member is speaking, no member shall pass between the member speaking and the chair.

RULE 7.—When a member is about to speak in debate, he shall rise from his seat and address the chair, and when two or more members shall rise at the same time, the chairman shall name the member who shall speak first.

RULE 8.—No member shall speak more than twice on the same question, nor more than once without leave of the board, until every member wishing to speak shall have spoken.

RULE 9.—When the debate or discussion of a question shall have been concluded, the chairman shall put the question in this form, to-wit: You who are of the opinion (as the case may be) say "Aye;" those of the contrary opinion say "No;" and the yeas and nays may be called and entered upon the journal at the request of any member.

RULE 10.—If the chairman doubt, or a division be called for, the members shall decide by rising—those in the affirmative first, and afterwards the negative—and the chairman shall determine by count, telling the number.

RULE 11.—Every member present when the question is put shall vote, unless excused by the board.

RULE 12.—In case there is not a quorum present, any number of members shall have power to adjourn; six to call the board to order and send for the absent members.

RULE 13.—Upon the call of the board, the names of the members shall be called by the secretary and the absentees noted; and absentees may be excused by the chairman when, in his judgment, the excuse is valid.

RULE 14.—No member shall absent himself from the board without leave, and all resolutions shall be referred to the Committee on Resolutions without debate, who shall consider same and report to the board some time during the session.

RULE 15.—When a question is under consideration no motion shall be received except to postpone, lay on the table, amend the previous question, commit or adjourn.

RULE 16.—A motion to adjourn shall always be in order and shall be decided without debate.

RULE 17.—The previous question shall be put in this form: "Shall the main question be now put?" and until it is decided shall preclude all amendments or debate. When, on taking the previous question, the board shall decide that the main question shall not now be put, the main question shall be considered as still remaining under debate. The effect of the main question being ordered, shall be to put an end to all debate, and bring the board to a direct vote—first upon all amendments reported or pending, being first applied to the amendment last moved, and then on the main question. The board may, at any time, by a majority vote, close all debate upon a pending amendment or an amendment thereto, and cause the question to be put thereon, and this shall not preclude further amendment or debate upon the main subject.

RULE 18.—Any member may call for a division of the question when the sense will admit of it; and when the question be considered divisible by the chair, the same shall be divided, from which decision of the chair an appeal may be taken by any member as a point of order.

RULE 19.—In forming the committee of the whole, the chairman may leave the chair and appoint a chairman to preside.

RULE 20.—The rules of proceedings in the board shall be observed in committee of the whole, so far as may be applicable.

RULE 21.—In all cases not provided for in these rules, the rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Cushing's Manual shall govern.

RULE 22.—The committees of the board shall consist as follows:

First—Committee on Equalization of Personal Property.

Second—Committee on Equalization of Lands.

Third—Committee on Equalization of Town and City Lots.

Fourth—Committee on Assessment of Capital Stock of Corporations.

Fifth—Committee on Assessment of Railroad Property (including the capital stock of railroads).

Sixth—Committee on General Equalization.

Seventh—Committee on Resolutions.

Said committees shall be appointed by the board and shall not be changed during the present membership of this board, except to fill any vacancy that may occur by death or resignation.

RULE 23.—Upon the completion of the work of either of the first three mentioned committees, their report shall be submitted to the board, where said report shall be opened to alteration or amendment by the board, or in committee of the whole, for at least forty-eight hours after the same has been reported, after which it may be referred to the Committee on General Equalization.

RULE 24.—After the report of the first three named committees shall be referred to the Committee on General Equalization, it shall be the duty of said committee to compare the values of the different classes of property with each other, and make such alterations as said committee shall find necessary to equalize the different classes of property with each other, and report its action thereon to the board: *Provided*, that for a more equitable equalization of the different classes of property, as aforesaid, if it is thought necessary by said committee to make any changes in the classification of property, as found in the several reports, such changes shall be reported to the board for instructions thereon before making final report.

RULE 25.—When the committees on the assessment of railroad property and capital stock of corporations make their final reports, said reports shall lie over two days for the inspection of the members of the board.

RULE 26.—That a committee of three be appointed by the chairman of the board, to be designated as the Auditing Committee, whose duty it shall be to investigate and report all expenditures of money ordered by the board.

RULE 27.—That the hour of meeting of this board, unless otherwise ordered, shall be 9:00 A.M.

RULE 28.—These rules may be altered or amended by a vote of two-thirds of the board, by the member or members wishing such changes or amendments giving one day's notice of the same in writing, setting forth the changes and amendments contemplated, and said rules may be suspended at any time by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

During the reading of the rules, Mr. Donoghue moved that each rule be considered adopted after its reading unless objected to, which motion prevailed, and objections to several rules were made by Messrs. Donoghue and Weber.

Mr. Crawford moved that the report be adopted as read, which motion was seconded by Mr. Martin.

Mr. Donoghue offered an amendment to Mr. Crawford's motion, to the effect that only those rules which had not been objected to during the reading of the rules, would be considered adopted.

The yeas and nays being called for on Mr. Donoghue's amendment, those voting in the affirmative were: Messrs. Cline, Day, Donoghue, Goetzman, Nightingale, Viterna, and Weber. Those voting in the negative were: Messrs. There being only seven affirmative votes, the amendment was considered lost.

The yeas and nays being called for on Mr. Crawford's motion, those voting in the affirmative were: Messrs. There being only eight negative votes, the motion was carried and the report adopted as read.

Resolved, That the Committee on Assessment of Railroad Property, the Committee on Assessment of Capital Stock of Corporations, the Committee on Equalization of Lands, Personal Property, Town and City Lots, and on General Equalization, be authorized to employ the necessary clerks to perform the clerical work of said committees. All of said clerks to be employed for such time as the committees may deem necessary, and at not to exceed \$5.00 per day for each day actually employed.

The Committee on Resolutions reported through its chairman, Mr. Murphy, as follows:

SPRINGFIELD, ILL., August 12, 1913

To the Honorable State Board of Equalization.

GENTLEMEN: We, the Committee on Resolutions, unanimously recommend the adoption of the resolution allowing committees on Assessment of

Railroad Property, Capital Stock of Corporations, Personal Property, Town and City Lots, and on General Equalization, to employ all clerks necessary to complete work of said committees, salary not to exceed \$5.00 per day.

GENTLEMEN: The State Board of Equalization was created by a due process of law some forty-two years ago, and by virtue of that law this board was charged with a specific duty, and in order that it may properly discharge that duty, it was also given specific instructions and certain authorities, all of which it was supposed should meet its requirements to properly discharge that duty in the best possible manner for the best interests and welfare of the people of our great State of Illinois in general and its taxpayers in particular. So far as I know, no change has ever been made in that law as regards its duties and its authorities, notwithstanding conditions have changed mightily since that time.

Gentlemen, I am of the opinion, and I believe every member of this present board agrees with me fully, that the State Board of Equalization constitutes one of the most important branches of our State government. Now, in order that it may properly accomplish the object for which it was created, and under present conditions, discharge its duties and obligations for the best interests and welfare of the people of our great State, and the business enterprises within the borders of our State or coming within the jurisdiction of this board, and discharge its obligations in a business-like manner, in truth, honor, and justice to all the people and interests concerned, it seems befitting and suiting present time and conditions, that changes in that law should be made whereby this board will be given greater powers and authority to organize in such manner and form and pursue policies as existing conditions may require, and with the object in view that this may be done in the best suitable manner, I do hereby move that the chairman appoint a committee of five from among the members of this board to draft proper resolutions embodying such suggestions and recommendations as in the opinion of the members of this honorable body, will best suit the purpose. And, further, that this body then present this resolution to the proper authorities with a request to give the same due consideration, and to exact a law in harmony therewith. This committee to report such resolution to this body for its adoption before the present session shall adjourn.

 SPRINGFIELD, ILL., October 28, 1913

To the Honorable State Board of Equalization.

GENTLEMEN: Your Committee on Equalization of Personal Property respectfully submits the following report:

We have compared the assessments of the personal property in the several counties of the State as returned this year by the local assessors and county boards of review with one another, and we have ascertained the rate per cent of addition to or deduction from the assessed valuation of personal property in each of the several counties of the State, to bring the same to the State average.

We have considered the relative value of personal property in the several counties, and believe that the personal property in the various counties should remain as assessed by the local assessors and county boards of review insofar that we find a proper relation of valuation between the counties.

This committee does not uphold the grave deficiencies in the assessing of personal property, believing that a vast amount of personal property escapes just taxation through failure to properly report the same. But as our duties are confined by statute merely to equalizing, we recommend that no addition to or deduction from the assessed valuation of personal property in any of the counties be made.

The bill also to provide that the State Board of Equalization be a perpetual body, one member coming from each Congressional District, the same as now, but with the change that half the members be elected at one congressional election and the other half at the next term; the term of office to be four years; and further, that a committee of seven be appointed by the chairman to draft a proper bill embodying these principles, as above set forth, and submit the same to the next Legislature with a recommendation for its passage.

GENTLEMEN: Your Committee on Assessment of Capital Stock of Corporations, having carefully examined the sworn statements of capital stock, schedules, and other evidence laid before it, begs leave to report the result of its labors in Schedules "A" and "B," which are made a part of this report.

And your committee would further report that owing to the late decisions of the Supreme Court, a large number of the corporations formerly assessed by this board, have been assessed by the local boards in their respective counties.

Schedule "A" shows the valuation and assessment upon the capital stock, including the franchise of companies and associations therein named, which have made a return showing the assessment against such corporation of its tangible property, as required by Section 32 of the Revenue Law. In all such cases your committee made an assessment of the capital stock including the franchise, and has deducted therefrom the assessed value of tangible property leaving the net assessment of capital stock, including the franchise over and above the equalized assessed value of the tangible property assessed by the local assessors.

Schedule "B" contains a list of corporations not making or causing to be made the sworn statements of capital stock required by Section 32 of the Revenue Act, and in all such cases your committee made a net assessment of the capital stock including the franchise over and above the equalized assessed value of the tangible property assessed by the local assessors. In all cases in said Schedule "B" the assessment of the capital stock, including

the franchise is an assessment in addition to and over and above any assessment of tangible property of such corporations which may have been made by the local assessors.

GENTLEMEN: Your Committee on General Equalization to whom were referred reports of the Committees on Equalization of Personal Property, Equalization of Town and City Lots, Equalization of Lands, assessed in the various counties, respectfully reports the result of its work in the following tables, viz:

Table "A" shows the assessed value and the equalized value of each class of property, assessed in counties other than railroad property.

Table "B" shows the assessed value and the equalized value of each class of property belonging to railroads which was assessed in counties.

Table "C" shows the rate per cent of addition to, or deduction from the assessed value of each class of property other than railroad property.

Table "D" shows the rate per cent of addition to or deduction from the assessed value of each class of railroad property assessed in counties.

We recommend that the rate per cent as set forth in tables "C" and "D" be adopted by the board as producing a proper equalization of the property in the several counties of the State for the year 1913.

WHEREAS, Much extra work for said clerks has been required this year in making comparative tables for the use of the committee; and,

WHEREAS, Much of the work of tabulating the returns might be done before the meeting of the board, thus saving much time of the committee; and,

WHEREAS, It is necessary for the clerks to work late many nights in order to complete the reports of the committee, and which said reports are then only in skeleton form, with many details to be filled in after their adoption by the board; and,

WHEREAS, All tables have to be made in duplicate and prepared for the printer, and the proofreading of the printed report; and,

WHEREAS, Under the resolution adopted by the board authorizing the several committees to employ the necessary clerks for such time as is necessary to complete the work; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Railroad Committee of the State Board of Equalization, that the clerks of said committee each be allowed 200 days in each year for work done prior to, during, and succeeding the session at the per diem fixed by statute.

GENTLEMEN: Your Committee on Assessment of Railroad Property respectfully reports that they have carefully examined the schedules and statements furnished by the various railroad companies, and by the Auditor of Public Accounts of railroad property, denominated by law "rolling stock" and "railroad track," and have included in the assessment against said companies, respectively, all lands, lots and blocks, described and included in the respective returns of said railroad companies as a part of Schedule "A" of railroad track, and have also included in such respective assessments all of the side or turnouts and second track, and all station houses, depots, machine shops or other buildings and improvements, belonging to said railroad companies, respectively on said lands, lots and blocks so described in said Schedule "A" of railroad track.

Your committee would further report that they have assessed according to the rules and principles adopted by this board, the capital stock including the franchise, of all railroad companies contained in Schedule "B," which is made a part of this report.

Your committee further reports that they have valued and equalized the capital stock including the franchise of each and every railroad company created under the laws of this State, in accordance with the rules and

principles adopted by this board for the assessment of capital stock of corporations, including the franchise, and we find that as to all of said railroad companies (except those included in Schedule "B") the equalized value of tangible property is equal to or exceeds the equalized value of the capital stock, so that the assessment of tangible property of said railroad companies (except those included in Schedule "B" leaves nothing to be assessed as capital stock.

RULES OF ORDER

RULE 1.—The chairman shall take the chair at the hour to which the board may have adjourned: *Provided*, that in the absence of the chairman, the board may elect one of its members temporary chairman, who shall preside, have the same powers, and perform the same duties as the chairman; shall immediately call the board to order, and on the appearance of a quorum shall cause the minutes of the preceding meeting to be read, and the following order of business to be observed:

First—Petitions and communications.

Second—Reports of committees.

Third—Resolutions.

RULE 2.—The chairman shall decide all questions of order, subject to an appeal to the board at the request of any two members. When an appeal is taken the chairman may address the board upon the point of order in dispute and the question shall be put, "Shall the decision of the chair stand?"

RULE 3.—When a motion is made and seconded, it shall be stated by the chairman or secretary before being debated.

RULE 4.—Every motion shall be reduced to writing, if the chairman or any member requires it, and any member may call for a statement of the question, which the chairman may give sitting.

RULE 5.—After a motion is stated by the chairman or read by the secretary, it shall be considered as in the possession of the board, but may be withdrawn by the member making the motion, by leave of the board, before decision.

RULE 6.—While the chairman is putting the question, no member shall walk across the room, and while a member is speaking, no member shall pass between the member speaking and the chair.

RULE 7.—When a member is about to speak in debate, he shall rise from his seat and address the chair, and when two or more members shall rise at the same time, the chairman shall name the member who shall speak first.

RULE 8.—No member shall speak more than twice on the same question, nor more than once without leave of the board, until every member wishing to speak shall have spoken.

RULE 9.—When the debate or discussion of a question shall have been concluded, the chairman shall put the question in this form, to-wit: You who are of the opinion (as the case may be) say "Aye;" those of the contrary opinion say "No;" and the yeas and nays may be called and entered upon the journal at the request of any member.

RULE 10.—If the chairman doubt, or a division be called for, the members shall decide by rising—those in the affirmative first, and afterwards the negative—and the chairman shall determine by count, telling the number.

RULE 11.—Every member present when the question is put shall vote, unless excused by the board.

RULE 12.—In case there is not a quorum present, any number of members shall have power to adjourn; six to call the board to order and send for the absent members.

RULE 13.—Upon the call of the board, the names of the members shall be called by the secretary and the absentees noted; and absentees may be excused by the chairman when, in his judgment, the excuse is valid.

RULE 14.—No member shall absent himself from the board without leave, and all resolutions shall be referred to the Committee on Resolutions with-

out debate, who shall consider same and report to the board some time during the session.

RULE 15.—When a question is under consideration no motion shall be received except to postpone, lay on the table, amend the previous question, commit or adjourn.

RULE 16.—A motion to adjourn shall always be in order and shall be decided without debate.

RULE 17.—The previous question shall be put in this form: "Shall the main question be now put?" and until it is decided shall preclude all amendments or debate. When, on taking the previous question, the board shall decide that the main question shall not now be put, the main question shall be considered as still remaining under debate. The effect of the main question being ordered, shall be to put an end to all debate, and bring the board to a direct vote—first upon all amendments reported or pending, being first applied to the amendment last moved, and then on the main question. The board may, at any time, by a majority vote, close all debate upon a pending amendment or an amendment thereto, and cause the question to be put thereon, and this shall not preclude further amendment or debate upon the main subject.

RULE 18.—Any member may call for a division of the question when the sense will admit of it; and when the question be considered divisible by the chair, the same shall be divided, from which decision of the chair an appeal may be taken by any member as a point of order.

RULE 19.—In forming the committee of the whole, the chairman may leave the chair and appoint a chairman to preside.

RULE 20.—The rules of proceedings in the board shall be observed in committee of the whole, so far as may be applicable.

RULE 21.—In all cases not provided for in these rules, the rules of parliamentary practice comprised in Cushing's Manual shall govern.

RULE 22.—The committees of the board shall consist as follows:

First—Committee on Equalization of Personal Property.

Second—Committee on Equalization of Lands.

Third—Committee on Equalization of Town and City Lots.

Fourth—Committee on Assessment of Capital Stock of Corporations.

Fifth—Committee on Assessment of Railroad Property (including the capital stock of railroads).

Sixth—Committee on General Equalization.

Seventh—Committee on Resolutions.

Said committees shall be appointed by the board and shall not be changed during the present membership of this board, except to fill any vacancy that may occur by death or resignation.

RULE 23.—Upon the completion of the work of either of the first three mentioned committees, their report shall be submitted to the board, where said report shall be opened to alteration or amendment by the board, or in committee of the whole, for at least forty-eight hours after the same has been reported, after which it may be referred to the Committee on General Equalization.

RULE 24.—After the report of the first three named committees shall be referred to the Committee on General Equalization, it shall be the duty of said committee to compare the values of the different classes of property with each other, and make such alterations as said committee shall find necessary to equalize the different classes of property with each other, and report its action thereon to the board: *Provided*, that for a more equitable equalization of the different classes of property, as aforesaid, if it is thought necessary by said committee to make any changes in the classification of property, as found in the several reports, such changes shall be reported to the board for instructions thereon before making final report.

RULE 25.—When the committees on the assessment of railroad property and capital stock of corporations make their final reports, said reports shall lie over two days for the inspection of the members of the board.

RULE 26.—That a committee of three be appointed by the chairman of the board, to be designated as the Auditing Committee, whose duty it shall be to investigate and report all expenditures of money ordered by the board.

RULE 27.—That the hour of meeting of this board, unless otherwise ordered, shall be 9:00 A.M.

RULE 28.—These rules may be altered or amended by a vote of two-thirds of the board, by the member or members wishing such changes or amendments giving one day's notice of the same in writing, setting forth the changes and amendments contemplated, and said rules may be suspended at any time by a ~~two-thirds~~ vote of the members present.

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
