PREFACE.

*To the Members of the Cleveland Bay Horse Society of
Great Britain and Ireland.*

GENTLEMEN,

The Retrospective Volume of the Cleveland Bay Stud Book contains, first, a short history of the breed ; and second, the record of 567 Stallions, foaled previous to 1st January, 1880.

The history of the breed presented considerable difficulties. Amongst these may be mentioned the scarcity of printed information respecting the older horses, and the entire absence of the pedigrees of some of them, it being considered sufficient by their owners to print the name of the horse and his service fee on the bill, his pedigree being apparently too well known in his generation to require even passing mention.*

Another source of trouble has been the many ingenious theories propounded respecting the origin of the breed. Writers on the subject seem to have taken little or no trouble to collect information respecting it, but have complacently set themselves the task of showing how the Cleveland Bay was the result of an elaborate system of crossing. Strange to say, the very obvious theory that the breed was originally what we term a pure one, has, with one or two exceptions, been lost sight of.

Yet the least inquiry in the districts where the horses were so largely bred would have satisfied these gentlemen that the breed was considered a pure one by those best qualified to form an opinion, and that for generations the tradition had passed from father to son that they were "clear of blood and black."

It is much to be regretted that the time spent in theorising was not better employed in collecting historical facts from some of the celebrated breeders who flourished in the earlier part of the present century.

I must here express my thanks to Mr. Lumley Hodgson, of Highthorn, for the interesting information with which he has supplied me so liberally, as well as to Mr. Thomas Parrington, of Ravenswyke, who has furnished me with many valuable statistics on the subject. The library of the Royal Agricultural Society was also placed at my service; and my thanks are due to the Secretary, Mr. H. M. Jenkins, for his

kindness in searching for the information required, thus saving me an immense amount of time and trouble.

The pedigrees are, without exception, compiled from old bills and cards of stallions, many curious and valuable collections of which have been placed at my disposal.

It has been thought advisable to divide these pedigrees into three parts.

The First Part, which forms the main portion of the volume, contains the pedigrees of horses of known purity of breed, and in many cases as far as five or six crosses have been given. Some of the older horses, however, have been admitted into this part of the volume when only the name of the sire was known, and some even when that was wanting. In these cases the horses had achieved the reputation of being the best sires of their day. Indeed, no one at all acquainted with Cleveland Bays requires to be reminded of the estimation in which such horses as Dart, Ralph Jackson's Forester, Skyrocket, Summercock, and The Hob Hill Horse, were held by breeders, and a glance at the genealogical tables will show what numbers of celebrated sires have descended from, or been allied to, these equine heroes.

The Second Part consists of horses of a comparatively recent date, the pedigrees of which, as obtainable now, have not been deemed sufficiently detailed to admit them into the First Part of the Volume. A few horses have been admitted here, possessing a distant cross of the Thoroughbred horse,

but the remainder of their pedigrees were so exceptionally good that the Editing Committee did not think it advisable to reject them entirely.

The Third Part is principally composed of those horses which occur in the older pedigrees. Many of them are nameless, and in a number of cases it has been impossible to find the name of the sire, and sometimes the name of the owner is likewise wanting; but the internal evidence is greatly in favour of their being pure bred horses, and they are certainly deserving of a record. There has been some difficulty in identifying them, and it is quite possible that in this part of the volume duplicates may occur.

The pedigrees of some of the older horses have caused a considerable amount of trouble, the cards and bills whence they are obtained being in many instances very vague and involved in their language; but care has been taken to obtain collateral evidence wherever practicable, and there is every reason to believe that they will be found substantially correct.

Another source of difficulty has been the frequent repetition of names, and the reckless manner in which the names of horses have been changed when they changed owners, a practice which sometimes obtains in the present day, and one which causes no small amount of confusion.

Perhaps the most conspicuous case of this difficulty is that of Agar's Rainbow 246. After he had obtained the reputation of being one of the best horses in his day, his

name was changed to King George the Fourth when he was 17 years old.

In cases where horses have been re-named both names have been given, but only one reference number has been used, excepting in the case of Agar's Rainbow. As he appears in so many pedigrees in his old name, and as he had gained such a high reputation as a sire before his name was changed, it was thought better to give him two numbers, thereby avoiding some confusion as well as the incongruity of his appearing as King George the Fourth in the days when George the Third was King.

Great care has been taken to avoid the entry of duplicate pedigrees, and in this direction at any rate I think success has been achieved.

The Editing Committee have held meetings at Thirsk and York, at which they have carefully revised the pedigrees contained in this Volume, and my thanks are due to them for the great trouble they have taken to collect and send me valuable and reliable information.

From their practical knowledge of the subject; and the careful investigation which the pedigrees have undergone at their hands, there is every reason to hope, that although from the nature of the work inaccuracies are apt to creep in, the information contained in the Volume will be found reliable.*

*I may say *passim* that the Editing Committee have been especially careful to reject any pedigrees containing any carting or roadster blood.

In case, however, any errors should be discovered, they will be corrected in a future volume; or, if necessary, a printed slip will be inserted, or sent to purchasers, pointing out the inaccuracies which have been discovered.

In bringing the Retrospective Volume of the Stud Book into life I trust it will supply a want long felt by breeders and purchasers of Cleveland Bays, and that it will be found both interesting and useful by all who take an interest in this valuable breed of horses.

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THE CLEVELAND BAY HORSE.

INTRODUCTORY.

THE early history of the Cleveland Bay, or Chapman horse, which is, I believe, the older name, is necessarily somewhat enveloped in obscurity. Printed records are few in number and contain but scanty information, and in many instances oral tradition has had to be solely relied on.

From an article which appeared in the "Farmers' Magazine" for the year 1823, of which further mention will be made, it seems that in the latter part of the last, and the beginning of the present century, Cleveland Bays had considerably diminished in numbers, owing to the pernicious system, introduced about that time, of coupling the mares with half-bred sires. Perhaps this diminution and the cause of it are indirectly responsible for some of the remarkable theories which have been brought into being concerning the origin of the breed.

PROFESSOR LOWE'S THEORY.

Professor Lowe, of Edinburgh, who wrote a book on the breeds of British Animals, gives it as his opinion that :—

"It is the progressive mixture of the blood of horses with
"higher breeding with those of the common race which has
"produced that class of coach horses usually termed Cleveland
"Bay, from the prevailing colour derived from approximation to
"the superior races, and Cleveland, from the fertile district of

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"that name, situated in the North Riding of Yorkshire, on the Tees. About the middle of last century this district became known for the breeding of a superior class of powerful horses, which, with the gradual disuse of the heavy old coach horse, became in request for coaches, chariots, and similar carriages. The breed is not, however, now confined to the district of Cleveland, but is cultivated throughout all the great breeding district of this part of England, although Cleveland still preserves its pre-eminence, and supplies with stallions those districts of the kingdom where superior coach horses are reared."

"The true Cleveland Bay may be justly termed a breed, from the similitude of characters presented by the individuals of the stock. It has been formed by the same means as the hunter, viz., by the progressive mixture of the blood of the racehorse with the original breeds of the country. But a larger kind of horse has been used as the basis, and a larger standard adopted by the breeder. By coupling a racehorse with a draught mare, an animal will be produced partaking of the properties of both parents, and which may be employed as a coach horse. But the results, as we before observed, of such a mixture are uncertain, and the progeny will probably be wanting in just proportion of parts. Many carriage horses are doubtless produced in this manner, but many of them, if their history was told, have been found to be worthless. *To rear this class of horses the same principles of breeding should be applied as to the breeding of the racehorse himself.* A class of mares, as well as of stallions, should be used, having the qualities sought for. It is in this way only that we can form and perpetuate a breed, in which the properties of the parents shall be reproduced in their descendants. The district of Cleveland doubtless owed the superiority, which it continued to maintain in the production of this beautiful race of horses, to the possession of a definite breed, formed not by accidental mixture but continual cultivation." *

OTHER THEORIES.

Others, following Professor Lowe, but exaggerating his theory, assert that the Cleveland Bay is the result of the

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progressive crossing of the thoroughbred horse and draught mare;* and it has even been asserted that the breed was originally produced by coupling a chesnut thoroughbred sire with a black cart mare, probably because bay is neither chesnut nor black. Professor Lowe's concluding sentences seem to imply a contradiction to the authoritative assertion contained in the earlier portion of the passage I have quoted. No amount of progressive crossing between the thoroughbred horse and draught mare could produce anything approaching the Cleveland Bay in appearance, constitution, or character, and this apparently is Professor Lowe's opinion. What, then, was the "common race of horse" with which "the blood of horses of higher breeding" was progressively mixed? Had Professor Lowe taken the trouble to collect a few facts respecting this "common race" he might have left us something more valuable than vague and inconsequent theory; and it is much to be regretted that no printed record is left of the horses which became so highly prized in the middle of the last century.

YOUATT ON THE ORIGIN OF THE COACH HORSE.

Youatt, indeed, throws some light on the Professor's words:—

"The origin of the better class of coach horse," says "he, "is the Cleveland Bay, confined principally to Yorkshire and Durham, with perhaps Lincolnshire on one side and Northumberland† on the other, but difficult to meet with

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"pure in either county. The Cleveland mare is crossed by a "three-fourths or thoroughbred horse of sufficient substance "and height, and the produce is the coach horse most in repute "with his arched crest and high action."

So if, in the foregoing extract from Professor Lowe's work, we read "coach horse" for "Cleveland Bay," and "Cleveland Bay" for "common race of horses," his remarks become more intelligible; but the loose way in which the terms are confounded shows him to have had little acquaintance with the subject, and is difficult to account for in a man possessed of scientific knowledge.

MARTIN DOYLE.

A much more reasonable theory, and one which from the character of the breed seems worthy of acceptance, is the following :—

"The Cleveland is said to be the true descendant of the "war horse. The knight who was encased in ponderous armour, "and who disdained the effeminacy of a carriage of any sort, "even on any occasion, required a powerful and enduring, yet "spirited and active horse, to bear his weight in real combat, "the tournament, or the lengthened journey. His first-rate "steed was accordingly of that noble kind which we see "in paintings and sculptures of the Roman war horse, and "which is presented in its main features in the Cleveland "coach horse."* *Martin Doyle. Cyclopædia of Practical Husbandry, 1843.*

But let us look a little farther back than the times of the mail-clad knight, of whom Martin Doyle speaks. •

* As bearing on the endurance of the Cleveland Bay on a journey the following instance, recorded by Mr. Lumley Hodgson, may be mentioned :— "Tommy Miles, of Harlsey, rode his Cleveland mare to York for a week together, to have his name called over as a juryman; he was in York by nine o'clock every morning (35 miles), and slept in his own bed at Harlsey (35 miles) every night."

Mr. Hodgson also says in his letter :—"I remember a Chapman mare old Parker, of Cundale, used to hunt with the Borobridge harriers, York and Bedale hounds. He was always in the same field with the hounds, and took the shine out of many a young swell on his 200 guineas hunter by getting over and through places he turned away from."

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ABORIGINAL BREED OF HORSES IN BRITAIN.

That a powerful and active race of horses was indigenous to the country from the earliest times of which we possess any record is well known, and it is scarcely likely that the diminutive pony of Wales should be the sole surviving representative of that race. Nor is it probable that animals of the type of the Welsh pony would inspire with terror or throw into confusion the trained legions of Rome, led by her greatest general. Yet that such a circumstance took place may be gathered from Cæsar's account of the invasion of Britain; and that he sustained something very like a defeat at the hands of the hardy islanders on his first invasion is, perhaps, not far from the truth; a defeat, too, mainly to be attributed to the war chariots of the Britons, and the admirable manner in which they were "served." Cæsar's spirited description may prove interesting, as it points out conclusively that the horses used must have possessed great power.

CÆSAR'S ACCOUNT OF THE BRITISH CHARIOT WARFARE.

"Their mode of chariot warfare is as follows:—First they ride about in all directions and hurl their darts, and by *very terror of their horses* and clashing of the wheels they frequently throw the ranks into disorder, and when they have penetrated between the divisions of the cavalry they leap down from the chariots and fight on foot. The charioteers, in the meanwhile, edge out of the battle by degrees and so dispose of the chariots that if they are pressed by large numbers of the enemy they have a ready means of retreat to their own men. Thus they possess the rapidity of cavalry and the stability of infantry in battle, and by daily use and practice they become so proficient that in *steep and precipitous places they are accustomed to maintain their horses at full speed and in a moment to check and turn them*, and to run along the pole and to stand upon the yoke, and from thence to dart back into the chariots as quickly as possible." *

The latter part of this passage shows that the horses must have been large and powerful. An undersized animal, however active, would have been incapable of stopping suddenly such a cumbrous vehicle as the war chariot when going at full speed "in steep and precipitous places." Then it would require a powerful, as well as an active, horse to draw these war chariots even on the rough tracks which in those days served the purpose of roads; and in battle, when the formidable scythes with which the axles of the wheels were armed came into use, the draught must have been considerable. That Cæsar was much impressed with the value of the British horse may be gathered from the fact that he imported some stallions to Rome—a fact interesting to breeders of Cleveland Bays as the commencement of the foreign trade.*

THE CART HORSE.

That the Cart Horse is not an aboriginal breed in England is an acknowledged fact, the earliest records of this breed pointing to a period subsequent to the Norman† Conquest. To King John is given the credit of making the first attempt, on a large scale, to improve the breed of cart horses by the importation of 100 stallions from Flanders; and Edward II. also largely encouraged the breeding of heavy draught horses by the importation of stallions and mares. These horses and their descendants would naturally be most largely used and bred in the home counties and those contiguous, the native breed gradually disappearing into the more remote and poorer parts of the country. Indeed, the old fashioned Yorkshire cart horse, with his legs nearly devoid of

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hair, and the Yorkshire prejudice in favour of "clean legged 'uns" and against the feather of the Shires horse, a prejudice by no means entirely removed, would seem to indicate that something like this has occurred; and it is in the more remote dales which have become peculiarly the habitat of the Cleveland Bay, that the native breed would be most likely to be longest maintained in its purity.

Such being the case, it may be asked, is it not, at any rate within the range of probability that the Cleveland Bay is descended from those horses, the very terror of which threw into confusion Cæsar's choicest legions?

PURITY OF THE CHAPMAN BREED.

But whatever theorists may say it is an undoubted fact that for generations the Chapman horse has been looked upon as a pure breed. From father to son has the tradition been handed down in the dales which became its home, that it was clear of "blood and black,"* and it is said that in the East Moor Dales between Whitby, Pickering, and Scarborough, it existed and was recognised as a pure breed, before the thoroughbred horse, as now developed, was known.

CLEVELAND BAY FAMILIES.

Cleveland Bay horses may be divided into three great families, to one of which almost every horse of note belongs. These are the descendants of Dart 88, Barley Harvest 447, through his grandson, Milner's Volunteer 338, and The Hob Hill Horse 316. Other horses celebrated as the ancestors of many famous sires are Nailor 208, Skyrocket 280, and Summercock 302, but most of their progeny are members of the three families alluded to.

THE HOB HILL HORSE.

Farmer's Glory 316, better known as The Hob Hill Horse, was the property of John Weatherill, of Hob Hill

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Farm, Skelton in Cleveland. Mr. Weatherill bought him at Yarm Fair when a yearling, and, unfortunately, no pedigree of him is forthcoming. Indeed, tradition says that he was bought out of a drove without a pedigree. Reliable information regarding the date when he was foaled is likewise wanting, but probably some time in the last decade of the 18th century may be assigned as the period of his birth. His grandson, Barnaby 15, foaled about 1808, would make this appear likely.*

It is subject for regret that there is no description of him extant, or that so little is known of him excepting his services as a stud horse. The "noted Hob Hill old Horse" are words which every horse owner is proud to be able to print on his cards and bills, and to him every breeder of Cleveland Bays likes to be able to trace the pedigree of his stock. Beyond the fact that he lived to an advanced age nothing more is known of the horse who is held in the same estimation by breeders of Cleveland Bays as is Broomfield Champion by breeders of Clydesdales.

BARLEY HARVEST.

Contemporaneous with the Hob Hill Horse—probably a year or two older—is Barley Harvest 447, the sire of Lamplugh's Victory 438, and grandsire of Milner's Volunteer 338, from whom descends a long line of horses rejoicing in the names of Victory and Volunteer.

MILNER'S VOLUNTEER.

Volunteer 338, was the winner of a prize of five guineas for the best coaching stallion at Howden, in 1806. This was considered a meritorious performance in his generation, and one which is made much of on the cards and bills of horses wherein his name occurs. He was half brother of Lamplugh's

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Volunteer 340, the sire of Rotsey's Volunteer 341, a celebrated horse in his day.

POMFRET'S VOLUNTEER.

From Rotsey's Volunteer was descended Pomfret's Volunteer 345,* a prize winner at the Cleveland Agricultural Society's Show, at Guisborough, in 1886, 1887, 1888, and 1889, and at Whitby in 1840. He was bred by Mr. Petch of Goodmanham, and was foaled in 1824; consequently he was twelve years old when he made his first great mark in a show ring. He has been described to me as a singularly handsome horse, light bay in colour, and perfectly clear of white.† He was very powerful but somewhat deficient in action.

DUNSLEY'S OLD DART.

Dart 83 was the property of Mr. Dunsley, of Horton, near Seamer, and, like his famous contemporary The Hob Hill Horse, he is without date or pedigree. He was the great grandsire on the sire's side of Rainbow 246, and Elegant 384, and from him through Rainbow descends a long list of successful sires.

AGAR'S RAINBOW.

Of Elegant's career little is known, but Agar's Rainbow has a wide reputation. When 17 years old Mr. Robert Thomas, of Eryholme, near Darlington, purchased him for £280, and changed his name to King George the Fourth.

Probably this change of name would occur about the time of the accession of George IV., in 1820, and if this was the case we may approximately fix 1803 as the date of his birth.

MASTER GEORGE.

His grandson, Master George 203, was perhaps the most successful sire amongst his descendants. He was the sire of

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many famous horses, and some of his daughters were as widely celebrated as his sons. Amongst the latter may be mentioned Mr. John Robinson's mare, (who was the dam of Sunflower) and Georgiana.

GEORGIANA.

Georgiana was bred by Mr. J. Dodsworth, of Great Stainton, and was the dam of several prize winners. She was from a mare by Short Legs 276. Mr. William Robinson of Thormanby purchased a filly foal from her which did him yeoman's service, both at the stud and in the show yard. She was accredited with twelve first prizes before the conclusion of her two-year-old career, and was the dam of several good horses, amongst them some excellent coaching stallions by half-bred sires. A colt from Georgiana won the first prize for coaching stallions at the Royal Agricultural Society's Show, at Battersea Park, in 1862, and he and his brother were there sold for the respectable price of five hundred guineas.

ARTICLE IN THE "FARMER'S MAGAZINE."

Reference has before been made to an article which appeared in the *Farmer's Magazine* for 1823, an article which seems to be so pertinent to the present position occupied by Cleveland Bays, as well as to throw considerable light on the past history of the breed, that I reproduce a portion of it.

After speaking of the kind of horse best adapted for working strong land, the writer goes on to say :—

"For lighter soils a lighter horse is required. Probably the best horse of this description is the Cleveland Bay, an original breed of the country, neither *blood nor black*, that is a distinct race from the English blood horse, and equally distinct from the black or cart breed of the country. It was the basis of the breed of the old London coach horse, when heavier cattle were used for these conveyances; and after the fashion became to adopt a lighter horse for carriages, this valuable breed was allowed almost to become extinct, till their excellence for agricultural purposes was noticed by some practical farmers in

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"the North of England, who for several years back have been exerting themselves to revive the breed."

Amongst these gentlemen, Mr. Thomas Masterman, of Nunthorpe, and Mr. John Richardson, of Langbarugh Hall, are especially deserving of mention.

MR. MASTERMAN.

"Tommy" Masterman, as he was generally called, was eminent as a breeder and owner of entire horses. Summercock 302, Scrafton, or Scrafter, 428, Forester 108A, and Skyrocket 280, were his property, but it is with the last that his name is now most frequently associated, and he was undoubtedly his best horse. His friends and neighbours presented him with a silver cup of the value of ten guineas in 1820, in recognition of the service he had rendered to the neighbourhood by *keeping* such first-class sires; the name of Skyrocket being especially mentioned.*

Strange to say, the only horse of Mr. Masterman's for which I can find a pedigree is Tom 433, and to not one of them can a date be assigned.

MR. J. RICHARDSON.

Mr. John Richardson was the breeder and owner of several horses, but excepting Drainer 89, he does not appear to have owned any stallion possessing extraordinary merit. Of Old Times 221 I can learn no particulars, but Yatton Lad 364, an exceptionally well-bred horse, as will be seen from his pedigree, was only a moderate animal. Mr. Richardson, however, was the owner of some first-rate mares, and it is probable that he bred some good horses for which, owing to want of information, he has not obtained the credit.

Mr. Masterman had six glasses engraved with a portrait of Skyrocket and himself. I remember seeing some years ago an old print from which the glasses were doubtless engraved, but, unfortunately, I have not been able to hear of or find a copy.

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MR. J. B. LLOYD.

Not only did the north country farmers of this date fully appreciate the value of the Cleveland Bay, but as far south as Gloucestershire their fame as powerful and active horses had spread. Mr. J. B. Lloyd, in an article in the first volume of the Royal Agricultural Society's Journal, gives an interesting account of his experience of the Cleveland horse.

"About the year 1827 I determined," says he, "to try if I could not have a breed (*i.e.*, of agricultural horses) with more activity and little or no diminution of strength, and fixed on the Cleveland Bay.* * * * A Yorkshire friend purchased for me a Cleveland Stallion, and I bought a few Gloucestershire cart mares as clean in the legs as I could get them. I have no farm horses, except two mares which I believe to be thoroughbred Clevelands, that are not descended from him, and I confess I am rather proud of my teams.

"When Old Cleveland was at his full size he measured 16h. 1½in. high, 9½in. round the pastern, 10in. round below the knee, 21in. round the arm, 15½in. round the knee, and 6ft. 10in. round the girth. When measured he was in good condition, but not what you would call full of flesh, his legs as clean as a race-horse."

This passage from Mr. Lloyd's article is interesting, as pointing out in a marked way one reason of the gradual decrease in numbers of the pure-bred Cleveland Bay, viz., the purchase of them for the purpose of improving other breeds; and also as containing a valuable tribute to their merits from a thoroughly practical man, as well as a description of a powerful stallion of the breed. That Mr. Lloyd omits to give a pedigree for the horse of which he speaks with so much admiration is to be regretted.

Conspicuous amongst breeders of Cleveland Bays and owners of Stallions, from about 1830 and for upwards of thirty years, are Mr. W. Hansill, of Castleton, and Mr. Henry York, of High Worsall, near Yarm.

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HANSILL'S HORSES.

Bay Chilton 25, Duke of Cleveland 95, Golden Pippin 128, and Richmond Lad 257, are amongst the most celebrated sires owned by Mr. Hansill, who is said to have been the largest owner of entire horses in his neighbourhood.

MR. YORK OF WORSALL.

Mr. York was a very successful breeder. In 1863 the first prize for Cleveland and the second prize for coaching stallions at the Yorkshire Agricultural Society's Show at South Stockton, were won by two brothers bred by him, viz., Prince of Denmark 293, three years old, and Yorkshire Lad 365, two years old.

They were both sired by Wonderful Lad 361, a horse also bred by Mr. York, and, perhaps, the best he ever possessed. He met with an accident when a yearling, slipping in the field and laming his back, and in all probability this caused his services to be retained for his native country. He was, notwithstanding, successful in the Show Yard, winning at Stokesley, in 1856, beating eight others, and again at Middlesbro', in 1860; whilst in 1860 and 1861 medals were awarded to him as the sire of the best foals in the yard. In 1861 foals by him were placed first, second, and third, in a good class at Yarm. He was as successful at the stud as in the show yard, for as well as being sire of the two horses already mentioned, which were sold for the foreign market at the conclusion of the show, he was sire amongst others of Captain Cook 44, King George the Third 164, Lucky Lad 190, Roseberry 264, Sportsman 297, Yatton Lad 364, and Whalebone 355. He will also be remembered as the sire of two of the most celebrated mares of their day, perhaps the two most successful that ever entered a show ring—Wonderful Lass and Sunflower.

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WONDERFUL LASS.

Wonderful Lass was bred by Mr. John Smith, of Long Newton. She was by Wonderful Lad, dam by Golden Forester 122, g dam by Richmond Lad 257, or Grand Turk ? * g g dam by Barnaby 15, and was foaled in 1855.

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an exceedingly good record, and there is no wonder that after the Royal Show Mr. Smith found a customer for her at £200.

MR. ROBINSON WATSON'S MARE.

Sunflower was foaled in 1862, bred by Mr. John Robinson, of Hutton Rudby, and was purchased at his sale by Mr. Robinson Watson, Stainton Vale, near Stockton-on-Tees. She was by Wonderful Lad 361, dam by Master George 203, g dam by Admiral 3, g g dam by Barnaby 15. The engraving, which has been copied from a drawing kindly lent by Mr. Watson, is considered a good portrait, and shows her to have been a remarkably fine-looking mare. She was as successful in the show yard as Wonderful Lass, as the accompanying record of her performances will show :—

She was, unfortunately, not very successful as a brood mare. She was generally put to a thoroughbred horse, and only bred one anything like a good one. Perhaps being continually kept in high condition for the purpose of showing may have had something to do with this.

From 1851 to 1867 the Cleveland Bay breed was in a flourishing condition, as may be gathered from the fact that in those years there was an average of nearly twelve brood mares exhibited at the Cleveland Agricultural Society's Shows, the smallest number being four in 1865, and the highest, nineteen in 1860.*

DECREASE AND ITS CAUSES.

After this time the pure breed began gradually to decrease in numbers, partly on account of Clydesdale and Shire horses coming more into favour, and partly on account of the heavy drain caused by a largely increased foreign trade. Heavy cart horses, too, brought abnormal prices, owing to the

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greater demand, then far in excess of the supply, caused by the rapid increase of mining operations, as well as general trade, throughout the north of England; and the suicidal policy of coupling Cleveland mares with carting sires was not infrequently adopted. From one cause and another the numbers shown gradually diminished, and many Agricultural Societies eliminated the Cleveland Bay classes from their prize schedules.

REVIVAL.

Indeed, amongst the larger local societies, the Cleveland Agricultural Society alone has always retained some classes for Cleveland Bays. The Hinderwell, Loftus, and Skelton Agricultural Societies have also done good service in encouraging this famous breed, and that their efforts have not been unrewarded the increasing number of meritorious exhibits at each succeeding show amply proves. In fact, as in 1823, a few practical agriculturists and horse breeders have strenuously endeavoured to revive the breed, and so far they have every reason to be satisfied with the result of their exertions.

CONFORMATION.

Mr. Lloyd's description of Cleveland gives a fair idea of what the Cleveland horse should be. From 16h. 1in. to 16h. 2½in. in height, he should be possessed of good sloping shoulders, a short back, powerful loins, and long quarters. His head is rather plain than otherwise, and on the large side, but it is well carried, and his general appearance denotes activity and strength, combined in a manner not seen in any other breed. His action is not remarkably high, but it is the kind of action for getting over the ground. In colour he is bay—either light or dark*—with black legs, clear of hair, and black zebra-like stripes on the arm and above the hock are sometimes seen. These are known as the black

* An erroneous idea prevails in some places that only the light golden bay is admissible. No greater mistake can exist, as many of the purest and best bred horses have been dark in colour.

points, and are supposed to denote especial purity of breeding. White, save a small star or a few white hairs in the heel, is not admissible, a blaze or white foot proclaiming at once the admixture of foreign blood.

Owing to in-breeding probably, the Cleveland Horse of to-day is of a lighter type than his predecessor, and to this "loss of bone" the attention of breeders should be especially directed with a view to its restoration.

Of the serviceable qualities of the Cleveland Bay little need be said. Adapted for the plough, a heavy conveyance, and slow saddle work, he is what the Americans term a "general utility" horse, and for artillery purposes his docility, strength, and endurance admirably qualify him.

CROSSING.

The value of the breed in improving others is too well known and widely acknowledged to need any comment, and to this may be attributed, in some measure, the decrease in numbers of pure-bred animals which took place a few years ago. On this subject the following passage from the letter of a well-known breeder and owner of racehorses, hunters, and cart horses—one who well knows and highly values the Cleveland Bay—is worthy of attention:—

"I am of opinion," he says, "that it will pay *the best in the long run* to breed pure-bred animals. The colts, if not good enough to keep entire, will readily find a market at a fairly remunerative price for tramways, vans, artillery, &c., whilst the mares if good ones will always command a high figure."

CONCLUSION.

I cannot better close this brief account of the Cleveland Bay than by commending these words to the careful consideration of breeders, at the same time expressing a hope that they may find in the accompanying volume much useful and interesting information.

The following extract from the *Whitby Gazette*, March the 29th, 1879, was sent to me by Mr. James Hindson, of Ugthorpe, near Whitby.

THE CLEVELAND HORSE.

Mr. G. Holmes, of Beverley, Yorkshire, has given this far-famed breed of Horses his special attention, knowing their great worth and value, and he has been most fortunate in sending them out to all parts of the globe.

The great merit of the Cleveland Horse is that he is not tainted with either Black or Blood—that is Black, or what is called Cart Horse, and Blood or thoroughbred—in fact they are a separate and distinct breed to themselves.

The Cleveland Horse is most valuable as a sire, as in putting the light Blood Mares to him, he gives bone, size, quality, and colour, and Mr. Holmes is of opinion that this breed should be kept up and by no means allowed to decrease. They have been very much neglected for some years, and light blood mares have become so numerous that they are almost useless, and he considers it is highly important that the Cleveland Blood Horse should be more encouraged than they are.

He thinks the following lines worthy of notice :—

Where Cleveland Hills in vernal charms are seen,
Clothed with the velvet of unfading green,
The noblest stock of England's far-famed steeds
With lavish care the thriving farmer breeds.
By sires for fleetness, and for courage known,
From mares for strength, and symmetry, and bone;
Bred for power, and all unstained with white,
Black-legged and bay, just as the ruby's bright.

All things that live have parallel, save one,
The Cleveland Horse : he alone has none—
Horse may with horse contend, the swift, the fleet,
As noble rivals on the course may meet.
Some for their shape, and symmetry, we prize,
Others for strength surpassing—some for size,
But in the noble Cleveland are combined
All the rare qualities that grace his kind,
Beauty in his strength, courage and wind, and speed,
And more than all, he claims a stainless breed.
