To the Chairman and Members
of the Committee on Hygiene and Statistics.

Gentlemen,

I have the honor of presenting to you my report for the year 1908.

Marriages.

The number of marriages for the year was 3,515 being 9.25 per 1,000 of the population, a diminution of 512 of the number registered during 1907 and of 0.24 per 1,000 as compared to the marriage-rate during the last 24 years.

This falling off was due, perhaps, to the financial depression which prevailed generally.

These marriages are distributed as follows:

French-Canadians	1,889 — 8.10 per 1,000.
Other Catholics	380 — 6.83 “ “
Protestants	1,106 — 16.60 “ “
Jews	140 — 9.22 “ “

I wish to draw your attention to the difficulty we meet with in trying to figure out correctly the number of marriages amongst our citizens of Jewish origin. Either through ignorance of our laws or because they do not fully realise the necessity of registering their marriages, many Synagogues neglect to send their annual reports to the Tutelle Office as the law demands, and, as a consequence, it is next to impossible to ascertain the number of marriages amongst them. These remarks apply also to the births.

Births.

The number of births in 1908 amounted to 14,606 or 38.43 per 1,000, an increase of 2.38 per 1,000 over 1907, as follows:

I regret to state that many medical men and fathers of families neglect to send their birth-certificates to the Board of Health as is required by law, and legal proceedings had to be taken in several cases without, however, completely remedying the neglect of this important duty. We have to complain also, of the way in which many churches fail to send in their registers to the Tutelle Office within the prescribed time thus preventing our annual report from being issued earlier in the year.

Deaths.

Our mortality for the year was 8,723 or 22.95 per 1,000 of our population, being 0.39 per 1,000 greater than in 1907. If we eliminate from this number the deaths of illegitimate children and of those prematurely born, the rate would be 20.70 per 1,000.

The mortality is distributed as follows:

Deaths from certain diseases.

Diarrhoeal diseases at all ages and in every form were accountable for 1,801 deaths, or 171 more than in 1907.

Phthisis: 711 deaths, or 48 more than in 1907.

Typhoid Fever: there were 126 deaths from this disease, being 4 more than in the preceding year. Though the number of reported cases was large (784) the disease itself was of a rather mild type.

Diphtheria: 581 cases reported of which 128 deaths, 57 more than last year.

Measles: 1,258 cases reported and 58 deaths, being 11 less than in 1907.

Scarlatina: 795 cases reported and 81 deaths, 64 more than in 1907.

Small-pox: there were 2 cases (strangers) reported but no deaths.

The mortality amongst children under 5 years of age was 4,804, or 55.17 per cent of the total mortality, being 1.44 per cent more than last year, an increase due, in a large measure, to the exceptionally long duration of the warm weather.

Special work: I was present at all the meetings of the Hygiene Committee: I worked at the by-laws regarding hygiene: I supervised the construction of the Levesque Bath.

I installed an apparatus in the north tower of the city Hall, to test and graduate syphons and to demonstrate the necessity of ventilating drains and syphons in dwellings.

As superintendent of public baths, I attended to the repairing, maintenance and administration of these baths.

The personal of the baths consisted of 5 male and 4 female caretakers.

The cost for the male caretakers amounted to \$1,152 and \$80 for the female ones.

Lighting cost \$150 and repairs and maintenance amounted to \$700 being a total of \$2,082.00.

The construction of a new bath at the corner of Marie-Anne and Boyer streets for the use of Duvernay and St. Jean Baptiste wards, was begun towards the end of October, it will be open winter and summer and be heated by steam.

The following table shows how popular these baths have become and how necessary they are in the poorer districts where house baths are scarce. It would be a good thing if there was one in every ward of the city.

In submitting my report to you for the year 1908, I wish to draw your attention once more to the necessity of having a census of our city made every five years in order to arrive at correct estimate of our death-rate, as I am inclined to think our population is greater than what I have estimated it at, namely 380,000.

Our births have considerably increased this year. Hitherto, it has been customary to count as "French-Canadians" all children baptised in churches frequented by French speaking catholics and to count as "Other Catholics" children baptised in churches frequented by those speaking other languages. This year I have placed under the latter head all children of other nationalities, such as Italians, Poles, Syrians etc., although they may have been baptised in French-Canadian churches. I have done the same for the marriages.

The marriage-rate decreased considerably in 1908, a decrease due, in a measure perhaps, to the financial crisis we have passed through, to the increase in rentals and cost of living generally.

I wish to draw your attention, also, to the increase of deaths from diarrhoeal diseases (diarrhoea in all its forms and at all ages). These diseases are very prevalent amongst illegitimate children of whom 259 out of a total of 670 (38.65%) died therefrom.

The deaths of children under 5 years of age was very great, reaching 4,810 or 55.14 per cent of the total mortality. Of this number, 670 or 13.92 per cent (7.69% of the total mortality) was amongst illegitimate children.

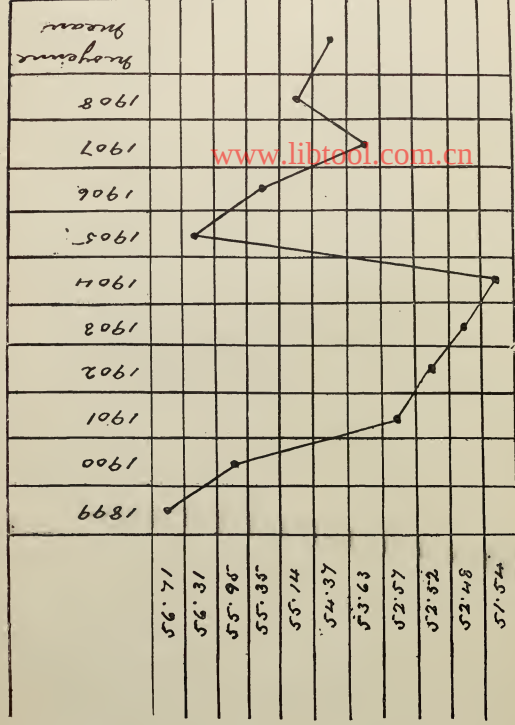

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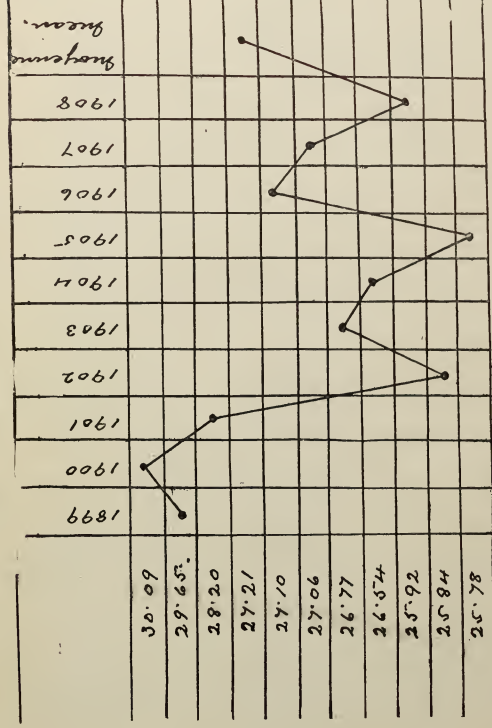


TOPOGRAPHICAL CHART OF DEATHS UNDER 5 YEARS OF AGE, MONTREAL, 1908.

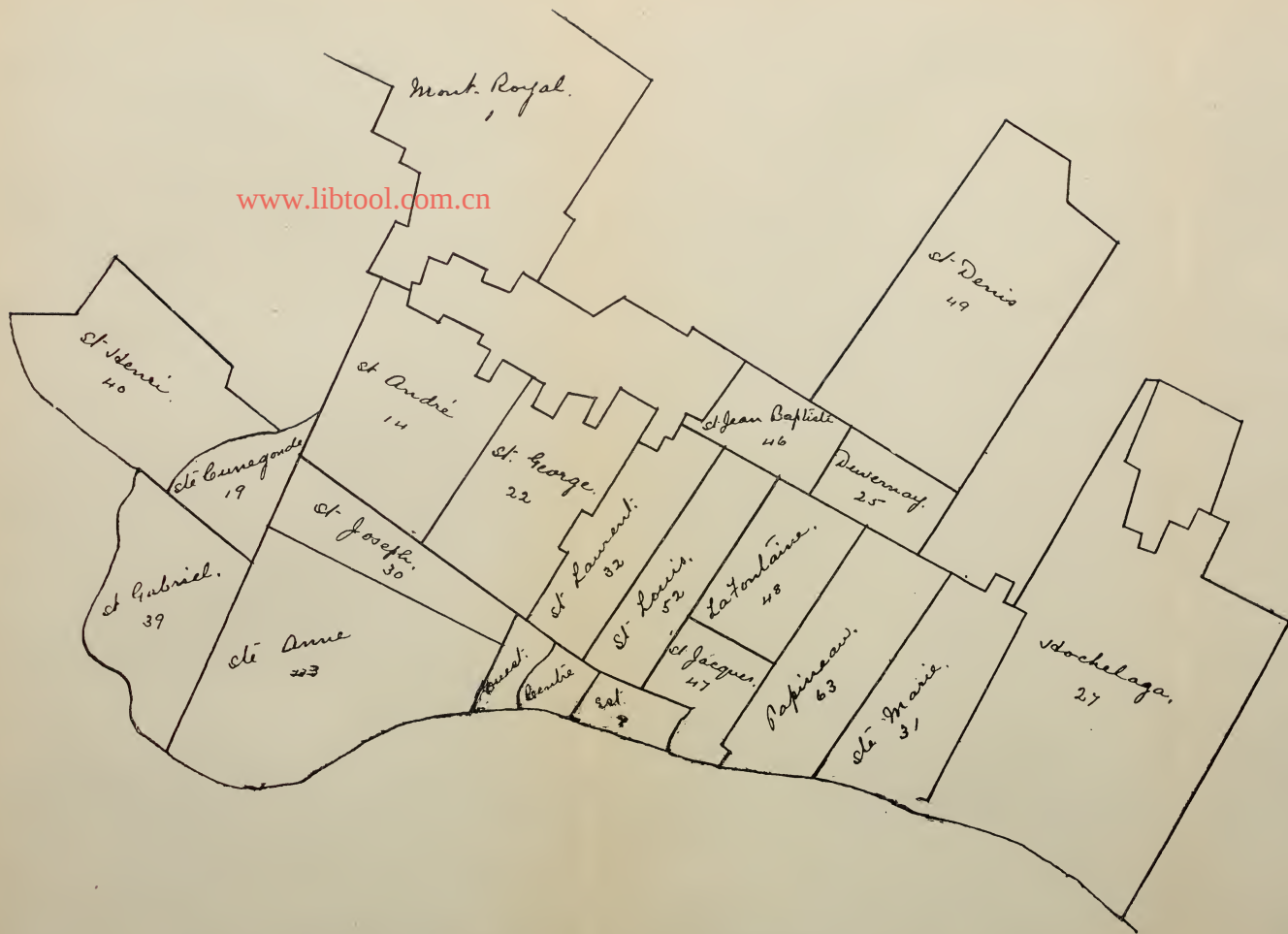

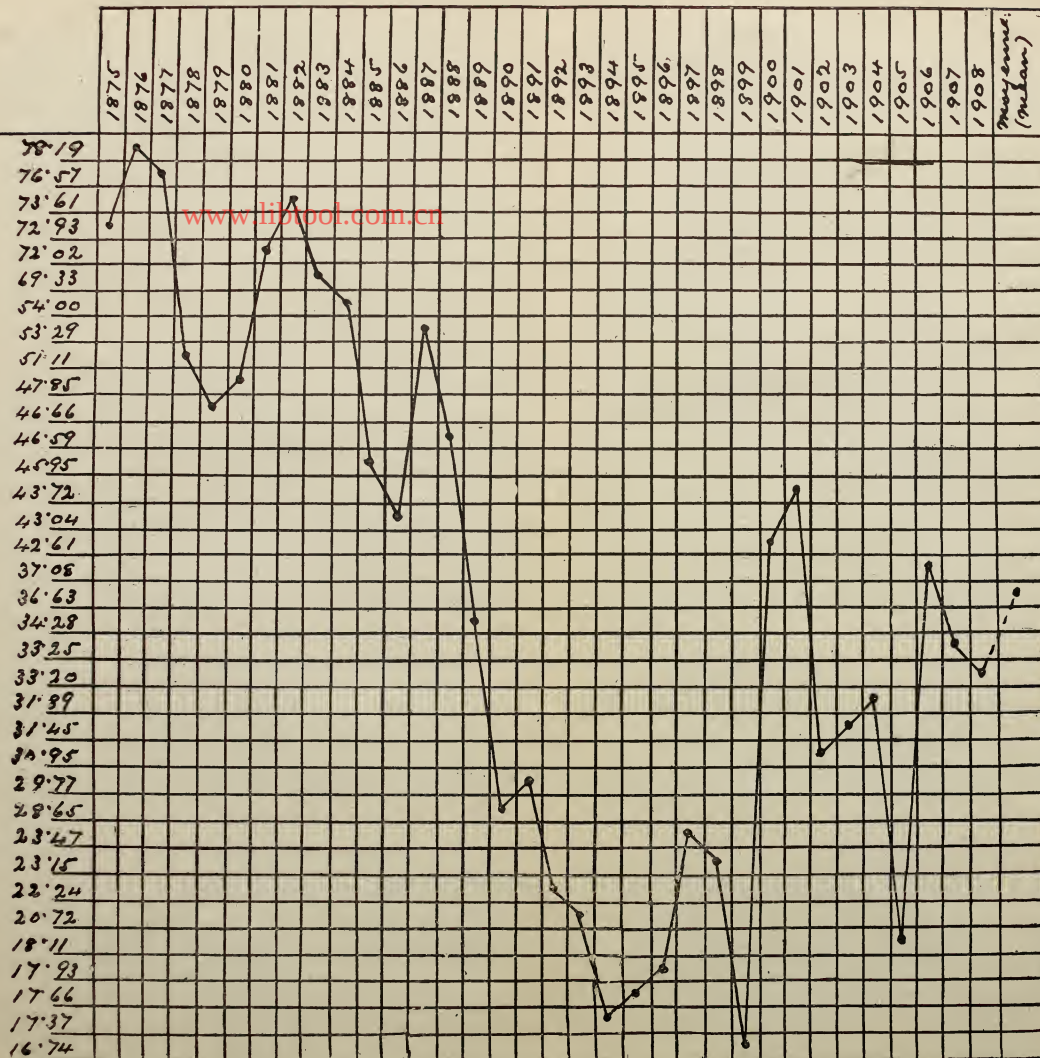

The greatest heat was 91.8° (Fah.) above zero on July 7th: the greatest cold was 20.6° below zero on Feb. 5th. The extreme range of temperature was, therefore, 112.4°. Greatest thermometer range in one day was 39.6° on Feb. 6th; least range was 1.5° on Nov. 25th. The warmest days were July 7th and 30th, when the mean temperature was 79.6° above zero. The coldest day was Jan. 30th, when the mean temperature was 15.2° below zero. The minimum relative humidity observed was 33 on June 6th. The greatest mileage of wind was 53 on Dec. 1st, and the greatest velocity in gusts was at the rate of 72 miles per hour on Dec. 1st, Mar. 31st, and Nov. 26th. The total mileage of wind was 127,857. The resultant direction of the wind for the year was S. 73° W., and the resultant mileage 59,500. Lunar halos were observed on 6 nights. Auroras on 34 nights. Fog on 14 days. Thunderstorms, total noted 35.

First sleighing of winter in city was on Nov. 17th. The first appreciable snow-fall of the autumn was on Nov. 14th. The first trace of snow was on Oct. 30th.
